IAO AGM - and prices held in spite of inflation

Our AGM took place last month in Blackburn Cathedral when it was confirmed that, in spite of continuing high inflation, there will be no change to the affiliation fee paid by local associations in 2024, which provides your continuing membership of the IAO. Our commitment to providing members with value-for-money was further emphasised at a later meeting when it was confirmed that subscription rates for the print edition of *Organists' Review* magazine will not be changed in 2024.

The AGM was followed by a recital given by IAO President for 2022-4, Robert Sharpe (see photo), which included works by Bach, Buxtehude, Pierre Cochereau, Francis Jackson and Jean Langlais. Admission was free, but the retiring collection will benefit our **Brereton Fund**, which awards annual grants to individuals and projects that support organ playing and choral singing (see also next page....).



IAO Organ Festival: York 2024

As reported in the previous e-NewsSheet, this event is to take place next year over four days from **Thursday 25 July**, with an open-consoles session involving up to a dozen city centre organs on the Monday morning. Few city centres could match such an opportunity! The festival will include recitals on the newly-restored organ in York Minster and the final stages of the IAO/RCO 2024 organ competition for young organists will be another important feature.



More details will be available in the next *e-NewsSheet* and booking arrangements will appear in the December edition of *Organists' Review*.

Unfortunately our colleagues at BIOS, who were the lead organisers for *OrganFest* this year, have reported that plans have been abandoned due to difficulties with the proposed main venue.

IAO support for a range of activities

With audience size for some 'live' events apparently being slow to recover after the pandemic, several local associations have recently benefited from IAO financial support through our Grant & Guarantee Scheme. This includes events at Banbury, Chelmsford Cathedral and Wimborne Minster.

This year's **Stanley Vann Scholarship** of £1,000 has been awarded to Tristan Weymes to support his postgraduate Choral Conducting course at the Royal Academy of Music. Our **Brereton Fund**, in addition to the usual annual grants for organ lessons, *etc*, has made grants of £2,000 each to Liverpool Cathedral (sponsorship of organ students) and the Swan Consort (choral workshops for state primary schools).
