## January 21st Recital by Anthony Gray

This was a very enjoyable recital at St. Joseph's, which was of particular interest

to me, because for a period of a few years I played the organ for Services and Weddings when the organist was not available.

I understood the difficulties involved in giving a recital on this instrument, owing to the absence of thumb pistons and composition pedals to aid stop changes, but Anthony

coped with this situation without any obvious problems, and I very much appreciated his performance. The Great Trumpet is rather weak, and difficult to use as a solo stop, but ,otherwise, the instrument gives a good sound. The "request programme" was interesting with a range of compositions in an historic sequence, starting with

Charpentier and working through to Francis Jackson, including

a nice tuneful Prelude by Anthony Gray!

The atmosphere in St. Josephs is comfortable, with a good decorative condition, nicely clean (with a good acoustic), and not cold, in spite of the severe outside temperatures. No doubt the slippery pavements prevented many members from attending, which was a great pity because they missed a very good event. **Graham Rayner.**
